Schützengesellschaft Männedorf Annual Shooting Program Overview

The following is a detailed description of all of the shooting competitions open to members that may be shot at the shooting stand Widenbad during the shooting season. This document does not include shooting competitions held at other shooting ranges.

The competitions listed in this document are open to both A and B members with the exception of the Cantonal and National competitions.

Non-Swiss citizens require a Kantonal Exception from the military authorities in order to participate in the Obligatory Program and Feldschiessen. If you are affected by this requirement please inform the President.

Each member has a blue plastic wallet kept in a box in the office. These wallets contain the Standblätte (score sheets) for the season. Once a shooter completes a shooting program they must return the completed Standblatt to the wallet. The Standblätte for each competition will be removed from the wallets once the deadline for that program has passed.

Please note that you are not allowed to throw away a used Standblatt just because you don't think you scored well. If there are any Stanbdlätte missing from your wallet, it will be assumed that you shot the program and you will be charged the entry fee.

The following abbreviations are used in the descriptions below:

Shooting Format

A5 – Round target, maximum score 5 points

A10 - Round target, maximum score 10 points

A100 - Round target, maximum score 100 points

B4 – Military target, maximum score 4 points

B10 – Military target, maximum score

E – Single shot – The result of each shot will be displayed on the screen. The number following the E denotes the number of shots to be fired.

S – Series – The results of the number of shots in the series will only be shown after all of the shots in the series have been fired. In cases where there are consecutive series' the shooter must wait until all of the results of the previous series have been displayed on the screen and the display shows "Bereit" before shooting the next series. The number following the S denotes the number of shots to be fired.

Weapon Categories

Kat. A - Standardgewehre and Freigewehre

Kat. D - Stgw 57-03 and Karabiner

Kat. E - Stgw 57-02 and Stgw90/PE90

Age categories

Age category is determined by the age of the shooter at the end of the calendar year

JJ – Youth – 10 to 16

J – Junior – 17 to 20

E/S – Elite/Senior – Elite - 21 to 45, Senior 46 to 59

V – Veteran – 60 to 69

SV - Senior Veteran - 70 and above

Multiple Program Competitions

Every year the club holds two competitions that include multiple shooting programs. These are as follows:

Vorstands-Cup

This is a knockout competition. On either the first or second shooting day of the season, each participant will draw a numbered token from a bag kept by the person responsible for distributing ammunition. The number on this token will determine the shooter you will compete with in the first program. If you win then you will go forward to shoot the next program in the competition.

The first program is the Cup Stich, detailed below. The next is Feldschiessen followed by one external competition chosen for each year, then the BSVM regional competition. Following these four programs the finalists will compete directly against each other in a two part program on the last shooting day of the year.

The results of each program will be factored depending on weapon category to ensure that shooters of different categories competing against each other are treated equally.

The prize is the Vorstands-Cup which will be engraved with your name and which you may keep until the following year's final.

The Annual Championship

In contrast to the Vorstands-Cup, this is not a knockout competition. The scores of a number of programs are added together and the shooter with the highest overall score wins.

The championship is split into two categories; sport weapons (Kat. A) and military weapons (Kat D. and Kat. E)

For the sport weapon category the following programs (all detailed below), must be completed:

- Sportstich
- Einzelwettschiessen
- Halber Liegenmatch
- Kantonalstich
- Kranzkartenstich
- Eröffnungsschiessen
- Kannenstich
- Bezirksschiessen
- The best four results of seven external competitions chosen by the board each year.

For the military weapon category the following programs (all detailed below), must be completed:

- Sportstich
- Obligatory Program
- Feldschiessen
- Kantonalstich
- Kranzkartenstich

- Eröffnungsschiessen
- Kannenstich
- Bezirksschiessen
- The best four results of seven external competitions chosen by the board each year.

As the maximum score for the Kannenstich is 100, the results will be divided by 10. For external competitions where the maximum score is not 100, the results will be converted to percentages of the maximum score.

The entry fee for the competition is Fr. 50.00. The entry fees will be put into a prize pot per category.

The prizes are awarded as follows:

1st Place – 50% of the prize pot

2nd Place – 25% of the prize pot

3rd Place – 15% of the prize pot

4th Place – 10% of the prize pot

A cup will also be engraved with the name of the winner (limited to military weapon category)

Individual Programs

This must be completed on either the first or second shooting day. No practice shots are allowed prior to shooting this program

Larger prizes for the top three

Scores are calculated as follows:

The sum of the 1st and 2nd shots is multiplied by the score for the 3rd shot and then the score for the 4th shot is added.

(1+2)*3+4 Maximum = (10+10)*10+10 = 210

Damenprogram

Only open to female shooters who are not participating the club championship

All participants receive at least one chicken

Additional chickens are awarded according to the ranking list of the sports, military and unlicensed shooter categories. Exact number is determined by the number of chickens available and

the total number of participants.

The top 50% of clubs are invited to shoot a second round at their home clubs. After the second round the highest ranked clubs will be invited to shoot in the national finals.

The completed Standblatt must be dated and signed by the shooter and a witness (Warner)

Federal Shooting Programs

Feldschiessen

This competition is held nationwide over one weekend in the last half of May and attracts over 100,000 participants each year.

Participation is open to all Swiss citizens over the age of 10 as well as foreigners with Swiss residency permits as long as they also have a permit from the Cantonal military authorities (Bewilligung zur Teilnahme an Bundesübungen).

Since the main Feldschiessen day is very busy and club members are required to assist in running the event, members are encouraged to participate on the Feldschiessen pre-shooting, usually on Thursday evening prior to the main day.

Club members and members of the military participating in the Obligatory Program may shoot Feldschiessen at any time up to 31st August under the supervision of a Schützenmeister. In all cases the Feldschiessen must be shot first and with no practice shots. There are no exceptions to this rule.

Only military weapons may be used (Karabiner, Stgw57 & Stgw90), including those with non-standard accessories as long as they are approved in the "Hilfsmittelverzeichnis)

Obligatory Program

This program must be completed by all military personnel and those who have not yet completed their military obligations.

The program may also be completed by those who are not in military service provided that they meet the same entry requirements as Feldschiessen detailed above.

For those who are obligated to participate they must score 42 or higher with no more than 3 zeroes. If they do not meet this threshold they must retake the test
